

PURPOSE:

The purpose of this report is to inform Council of the monthly payments that sport clubs have to pay from 1 July 2017 and also to include tariffs for all other sports facilities and clubs in Matlosana. The <u>term</u> of lease regarding contracts will be 24 months (two years). Attached Annexure "D", is the proposed contract that can be used between Council and the Sports Clubs.

The Sports Council supports the proposed tariffs, which were increased by -+9%

BACKGROUND:

Council reconsiders the tariffs of lease and service accounts of sports clubs every 24months.

New tariffs must be implemented with effect from the July 2017 accounts in terms of Section 75A of the Local Government Municipal Systems Act 2000 as amended.

RECOMMENDATION:

- a) That the proposed tariffs of lease and service accounts of Sports Clubs for the 2016/2017 and 2017/2018 financial years as set out in Annexure "B" and for schools as set out in Annexure "D" that includes VAT of 14% be approved and be implemented with effect from 1July 2017 account in terms of Section 75A of the Local Government Municipal Systems Act 2000 as amended.
- b) That should sports clubs want to make use of community halls other than on the times stipulated, bookings be made in advance for the specific days and that the current tariffs be applicable.
- That when any sports facility is used after 24:00, an additional fee be levied plus the cost of the electricity as per tariffs
- d) That the proposed draft contract between Council and Sports Clubs as reflected in Annexure "D" be approved.
- e) That the Deputy Director SAC be granted delegated powers to remove or to add a club on the attached list or terminate their contract with the Council during the two years.
- f) That sport facilities only be used for sports related activities, official events of Council or events that has been approved by the Council and Sports Council.
- g) That Clubs that are in arrears with the hiring fees on 28 February 2016 Council with more than R1000.00, contracts not be renewed. (Section B)
- h) That Council approves the tariffs as per attachment A, B, C and D.
- That Council approve the usage of all Stadiums and Sports halls for other events other than Sport.
- j) That these tariffs be considered for the 2017/18 Annual Budget.
- k) That in arranging of all type of events, the necessary legislation (Sport and Recreational Events Act 2 of 2010) be adhered to, and that required documentation in this regard be submitted at least 7 days before the starting of the event. If the required documents are not received 7 days before the event, the event will not be allowed to continue.

That the draft agreement and checklist attached to the report be approved when these events are organised.

m) That the Street Festival organisers be allowed to use the Recreation Centre annually on a two year lease contract.





ACT

To provide for the core principles, mechanisms and processes that are necessary to enable municipalities to move progressively towards the social and economic upliftment of local communities, and ensure universal access to essential services that are affordable to all; to define the legal nature of a municipality as including the local community within the municipal area, working in partnership with the municipality's political and administrative structures; to provide for the manner in which municipal powers and functions are exercised and performed; to provide for community participation; to establish a simple and enabling framework for the core processes of planning, performance management, resource mobilisation and organisational change which underpin the notion of developmental local government; to provide a framework for local public administration and human resource development; to empower the poor and ensure that municipalities put in place service tariffs and credit control policies that take their needs into account by providing a framework for the provision of services, service delivery agreements and municipal service districts; to provide for credit control and debt collection; to establish a framework for support, monitoring and standard setting by other spheres of government in order to progressively build local government into an efficient, frontline development agency capable of integrating the activities of all spheres of government for the overall social and economic upliftment of communities in harmony with their local natural environment; to provide for legal matters pertaining to local government; and to provide for matters incidental thereto.

Preamble

Whereas the system of local government under apartheid failed dismally to meet the basic needs of the majority of South Africans;

Whereas the Constitution of our non-racial democracy enjoins local government not just to seek to provide services to all our people but to be fundamentally developmental in orientation;

74. Tariff policy

- (1) A municipal council must adopt and implement a tariff policy on the levying of fees for municipal services provided by the municipality itself or by way of service delivery agreements, and which complies with the provisions of this Act, the Municipal Finance Management Act and any other applicable legislation. [Sub-s. (1) substituted by s. 10 of Act 44/2003]
- (2) A tariff policy must reflect at least the following principles, namely that-
 - (a) users of municipal services should be treated equitably in the application of tariffs
 - (b) the amount individual users pay for services should generally be in proportion to their use of that service;
 - (c) poor households must have access to at least basic services through-
 - (i) tariffs that cover only operating and maintenance costs,
 - special tariffs or life line tariffs for low levels of use or consumption of services or for basic levels of service; or
 - (iii) any other direct or indirect method of subsidisation of tariffs for poor households;
 - (d) tariffs must reflect the costs reasonably associated with rendering the service, including capital, operating, maintenance, administration and replacement costs, and interest charges;
 - tariffs must be set at levels that facilitate the financial sustainability of the service, taking into account subsidisation from sources other than the service concerned;
 - provision may be made in appropriate circumstances for a surcharge on the tariff for a service;
 - (g) provision may be made for the promotion of local economic development through special tariffs for categories of commercial and industrial users;
 - the economical, efficient and effective use of resources, the recycling of waste, and other appropriate environmental objectives must be encouraged;
 - the extent of subsidisation of tariffs for poor households and other categories of users should be fully disclosed.
- (3) A tariff policy may differentiate between different categories of users, debtors, service providers, services, service standards, geographical areas and other matters as long as the differentiation does not amount to unfair discrimination.

(Section 75: Decided cases)

75. By-laws to give effect to policy

- A municipal council must adopt by-laws to give effect to the implementation and enforcement of its tariff policy.
- (2) By-laws in terms of subsection (1) may differentiate between different categories of users, debtors, service providers, services, service standards and geographical areas as long as such differentiation does not amount to unfair discrimination.

(Section 75A: Decided cases)

75A. General power to levy and recover fees, charges and tariffs

- (1) A municipality may-
 - (a) levy and recover fees, charges or tariffs in respect of any function or service of the municipality; and
 - (b) recover collection charges and interest on any outstanding amount.
- (2) The fees, charges or tariffs referred to in subsection (1) are levied by a municipality by resolution passed by the municipal council with a supporting vote of a majority of its members.
- (3) After a resolution contemplated in subsection (2) has been passed, the municipal manager must, without delay-
 - (a) conspicuously display a copy of the resolution for a period of at least 30 days at the main administrative office of the municipality and at such other places within the municipality to which the public has access as the municipal manager may determine;

(Section 75A(3)(b): Decided cases)

- (b) publish in a newspaper of general circulation in the municipality a notice stating-
 - that a resolution as contemplated in subsection (2) has been passed by the council;
 - (ii) that a copy of the resolution is available for public inspection during office hours at the main administrative office of the municipality and at the other places specified in the notice; and
 - (iii) the date on which the determination will come into operation; and
- (c) seek to convey the information referred to in paragraph (b) to the local community by means of radio broadcasts covering the area of the municipality.
